Statement of Significance The house was built in 1916 by Charles McCleary, son of lumber magnate Henry McCleary. The younger McCleary worked with his father. His wife Vivian Gose McCleary was the daughter of Mack Gose, Supreme Court Justice from 1909 to 1915. The house was purchased in 1941 by Supreme Court Justice John S. Robinson who served from 1937 to 1951. Born in 1880 in Ohio, he studied at Columbia Law School and practiced in Seattle from 1910 to 1937.

Description of Physical Appearance The McCleary House is a large, two-and-one-half-story wood frame structure built in the Craftsman style on a poured concrete foundation. Its gable roof is covered with composition shingles and has wide bracketed eaves, exposed rafters and wide gable-end fascia boards. Walls are clad with wood shingles, with horizontal banding between stories, and the first story shingles are in alternating wide and narrow courses. The front (south) facade has an offset gable above a projecting portion of the facade. A central one-story gabled porch with square posts shelters the main entry door. The west wall has a side entry door. Spanning the east facade is a one-story enclosed porch, offering views of downtown Olympia. The driveway leads along the north facade to a double garage at the northeast corner.
